**LANGUAGES OF THE PACIFIC**

**An Introduction to Languages of the Pacific**  
**(PASI 2020 / PASI 6020)**  
**Semester 2, 2009**

The Pacific is a region of astounding linguistic diversity, containing a fifth of the world's 6,000 languages.

This new course, the first of its kind to be offered in an Australian university, provides an introductory overview to the languages of the Pacific, extending from Timor in the west through the island of New Guinea out through Melanesia into Pacific Polynesia.

It deals equally with the Austronesian languages which were brought into the region 3,000 years ago by seafaring immigrants from Taiwan, and the many Papuan languages whose history goes back deeper in time and which are geographically focussed on the island of New Guinea with outliers in Timor, the Moluccas, and the Solomon Islands. No previous exposure to linguistics or to Pacific languages is assumed.

The course will be offered in second semester as a team-taught second/third year subject, in semi-intensive mode: a mixture of regular lectures and intensive longer sessions.
